1.	<p>In chapter 2.1.3. the following is mentioned: Number of proposals and grants per applicant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• An applicant may submit more than 1 proposal under this call for proposals.• An applicant may not be awarded more than 1 grant under this call for proposals.• An applicant may not be awarded more than 1 grant per lot under this call for proposals.• An applicant may not at the same time be partner in another application.• Partners may not take part in more than one application. <p>Although we understand that we can only be granted one contract (either Lot1 or Lot 2) we are intending to apply for both Lots. However, do we have to apply with a different partner in these two proposals? (Referring to: Partners may not take part in more than one application)</p>	<p>Each proposal is to be meant as an application. As a consequence, different partners are necessary in order to submit two applications.</p>
2.	<p>In the FAQ 1 - Publication ref.: EuropeAid/128919/C/ACT/RS - it is stated that only one component has to be implemented for each action. (this answer is related to chapter 2.1.3 of the guidelines) However, in chapter 2.1.3. of the guidelines – action 2 (Enhancement of living conditions) the components are not listed in a row and only here it is mentioned that “in addition the following housing schemes will be offered”. Could you please clarify if the answer already published by the delegation is also referring to this action, or if this means that it is mandatory to implement the first component in this particular action. (action 2)</p>	<p>The answer already published by the Delegation applies to this action too.</p> <p>Three components are included in this Action 2. Applicants can choose (one or more) among all three components.</p>
